Hike Difficulty Ratings



EASY - A short distance hike on fairly level ground.



MODERATE - A longer distance walk on fairly level ground, or a short distance with some hills.



HARD - A long distance walk with hills and some obstacles.

Note: Distances to all site markers were measured using a standard smart phone app. The total distances listed for each hike are roundtrip, unless specified otherwise.

HOW DO I GET STARTED?

1. Choose a Site Marker!

Look through your **Ledger** (program guide) and choose the site marker you want to find.



2. Find your Route!

Follow the driving directions on page 18 that will take you to the parking area for your site marker's hike.



3. Ready, Set, Hike!

Follow the clues on the site marker page to find the starting point and where you can find the post.



4. Remember the Code!

At the post, use a crayon or pencil to fill in the space on your rubbing sheet. Don't forget to copy the 4-digit code – you'll need it later!



5. Back to the Start!

Each hike includes directions to get back to your vehicle. Take any trash with you to keep things neat and tidy!



6. Go Online!

Use the **Beanstack** app (computer or phone) to enter your code. You can also log any reading minutes there!



7. Repeat as Needed!

Keep hiking and entering site marker codes in **Beanstack**. You can enter drawings for great prizes while you stay active this summer!

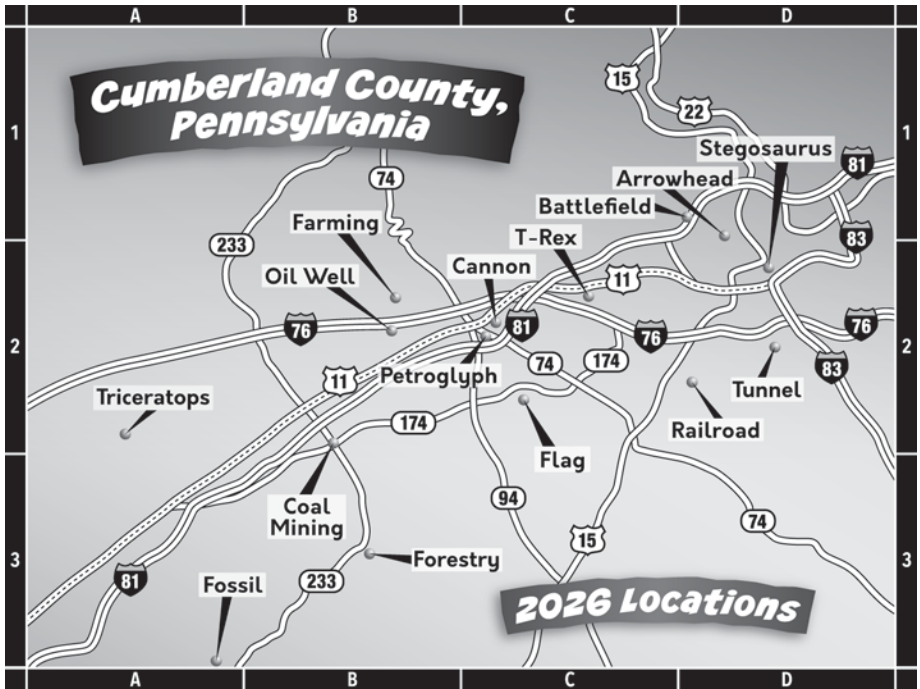

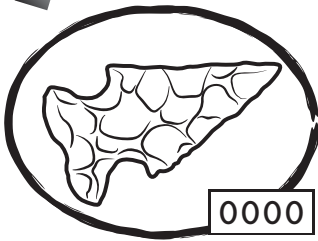

CLUES for your hike!

1. From the parking area, head past the pavilion to the Nature Trail behind the pavilion.
2. Follow the trail downhill and stay straight on the trail, keeping the wooden fence on your left.
3. The trail goes uphill, curves right, and the river is now on your left.
4. Cross a small bridge, head uphill, and when you reach the top, turn right onto the paved path.
5. At the Y, stay right and carefully cross the road.
6. At the T and Midway Pavilion, turn left. Notice the Butterfly Garden on your left.
7. You will pass the Memorial Pavilion on your right and then turn right on the path.
8. At the Y at the train caboose, stay left and pass the caboose. Take a photo of the caboose for fun.
9. The path winds up and then turns left and around the building. Turn right after the building to stay on the path.
10. The post will be on your right by a tree.
11. Continue on the path in the same direction. Just past the baseball field, turn right on the path and back to the parking area.

An arrowhead is the sharp, pointed tip of an arrow, but not all pointy stones are arrowheads.

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the parking area near the daycare center and the gate. There may be a large white bin to place flags for proper disposal.
2. Start on the path and walk to the next gate. Go straight past the gate and cross over Pine Run.
3. Follow the path, taking the time to read the signs. You will pass 2 gazebos on your right at the top of the hill.
4. There is a very cool Naval propeller on display on your left and an anchor on your left.
5. At the Captain Leon Lock Veterans Memorial circular seating area, turn left and then take the 2nd right onto the path. You will see a large tank on your right. Turn right on the path toward the tank.
6. Follow the path around and at the last bench on your right, the post will be on your left.
7. Continue on the path in the same direction and when you reach the next junction, turn right, passing the flagpole. Keep right and return to the parking area by retracing your steps.

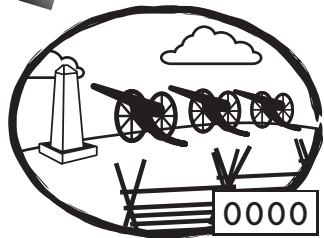

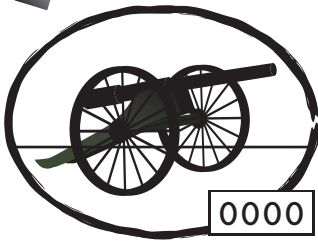

CLUES for your hike!

1. Pick up the path at the entrance to the parking area, just behind the building. There is a sign that points in the direction of the Labyrinth.
2. You will pass a play structure on your left, and then the path curves around, and you will pass fitness station Beam Jump on your right.
3. You will walk past the Labyrinth on your left and fitness station Push-Up Station on your right.
4. Go past the sand volleyball courts on the left and stay straight on the path. The post is ahead on your right by the fitness station Chin-Up Station.
5. Continue on the path back to the parking area.

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the stone parking area near the basketball court.
2. Start on the path to the left of the parking area, near the "Welcome to Centerville Park" sign.
3. Stay straight on the path, to keep the pickleball courts on your right.
4. Follow the path as it curves right around the playground. Pass the swing set on your right and continue on the path.
5. Continue on the path and take the left as the path goes toward a field and trees.
6. The path will then curve right toward a fence and then curves right again. You are now walking along the fence.
7. The post will be ahead on your left, at the corner of the fence.
8. Stay on the path and keep walking in the same direction. At the top of a small hill, take the left on the path.
9. Continue on the path back toward the basketball court, then turn left to the parking area.

CLUES for your hike!

1. Enter the walking path by going past the large gate, with the dam on your right side.
2. Walk up the gravel path to the top of the dam and then enter the path along the left side of the lake. You will see light blue blazes on trees as it goes uphill.
3. As this path goes up and down hills, just continue to follow the blue blazes.
4. You will pass a post on your right that says 1.5 – keep going.
5. Pass a bench and a sign that says Hardwood Forest next 0.5 miles.
6. Cross over the bridge as the trail wraps around the lake.
7. You will pass a bench on your right and eventually another Hardwood Forest sign. The post will be ahead on your left, just before another bridge.
8. Turn around and retrace your steps back to the parking area.

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park in the first parking area as you enter the park, immediately on your right. Start on the path by the pavilion and turn left, walking toward the flagpole.
2. Carefully cross the park entrance road to the gravel path, with the flagpole on your right and the road on your left.
3. Continue straight past the next intersection. Keep right on the path at the triangle and head up a long hill. Halfway up the hill you will pass a bench on your left.
4. At the top of the hill, stay right at the triangle, with the bench on your left.
5. Continue on the path along the tree line. At the next intersection, stay straight, passing the football field goal post on your right.
6. The path curves right at disc golf basket #8.
7. Turn right at the next intersection by a bench and walk toward the pavilion.
8. Just past the pavilion, turn left and the post will be ahead on your right.
9. Continue on the path, passing another pavilion on the right. Stay on the path back to the parking area.

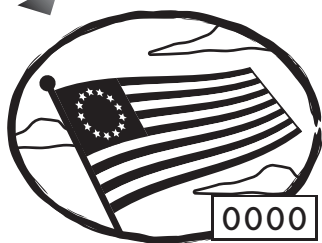

CLUES for your hike!

1. From the parking area, head toward the building by the lake and turn left at the first intersection, just before the building. Keep the building on your right.
2. The paved path turns to gravel, bending right with a tree stump on the right and a grass field straight ahead. This is Fuller Field.
3. Turn left off the path into the grass and head straight across the field, staying in the middle of the field. Look for the mowed opening at the far end of the field in the middle of the tree line. You will see a white sign for the trail.
4. Cross the bridge and turn left to follow the trail with the yellow blazes on the trees. You will be going slightly uphill.
5. When you reach a tree with two yellow blazes, turn right. There is a post here that says E39.
6. At the next tree with two yellow blazes, stay left. You will see a tree with a yellow blaze. Watch your step as there are lots of roots as you go downhill.
7. The trail will curve left, narrowing and curving right. As you pass a tree with two yellow blazes, the path curves right and widens.
8. Cross under a tree and keep going. The path curves right again, following the yellow blazes. Cross the wooden bridge and continue as the path curves right.
9. At the next bridge, turn slight right to stay on the path. The post is just ahead on your right.
10. Continue in the same direction with the water on your left. Keep following the yellow blazes.
11. Stay on the path with the yellow blazes and cross a small concrete slab; just ahead will be a large concrete slab.
12. Continue on the path along the water going uphill for a bit. Go down the wooden steps and downhill, then the rock steps.
13. Keep walking down into a small gulley, passing a post, and up the other side. Cross the bridge, go back across the field and back to the parking area.

CLUES for your hike!

1. From the parking area, walk toward the bridge for about ten yards and look for the entrance to the trail on your left. The trail goes into the woods, down some rock steps.
2. Start following the yellow markers on the trees. Notice all the beautiful pine trees.
3. Continue following the yellow marked path, eventually coming to a large lake on the right.
4. From the lake, make a small left turn and cross over the wooden bridge.
5. Continue following the yellow marked trail, which will go over rocks, over more rocks, and over more rocks.
6. Keep walking over the rocks, following the yellow marked trail; it's not much farther.
7. As you walk down a slight hill on the path, the post will be found near a tree.
8. To return to your vehicle, retrace your steps to the parking area.

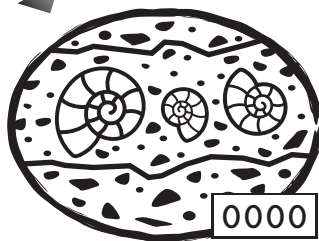

CLUES for your hike!

1. Start on the sidewalk near the pavilion, with the pavilion and play area on your right. Walk toward the flagpoles.
2. Turn left at the flagpoles and then left again. When you reach the path, head straight, through a parking area, toward pavilion 2 with Nicholas Morrison baseball field on your right and a small shed on your left.
3. Halfway through the parking area, take the path to the left, with disc golf basket #16 on your left and #14 on your right.
4. At the next small parking area, carefully cross it to the path just past the pavilion. You will quickly pass disc golf basket #11 on the right.
5. As you walk you will pass a small playground on your right. Stay straight on the wide road/path with the swings on your right.
6. Just past the swings, turn right on the path and then stay left with the open field on the right.
7. Bear right at the next turn, keeping the baseball field on your right. The path goes around the open field.
8. When you reach the area near the flagpoles, make a U-turn/left to stay on the path with the fence on your left and soccer fields on the right.
9. Walk past disc golf basket #4 and follow the path around the fields. Just past the bleachers, the post will be on your right.
10. Continue on the path in the same direction and at the next Y, bear right toward the playground. Take the first left, up a small hill toward the pavilion and back to the parking area.

CLUES for your hike!

1. Enter the path on the trail by the Emergency and Authorized Vehicles Only sign.
2. The path will curve left, then take the 1st right. At the T, turn right. At the Y, stay right.
3. At the top of the small hill, take the 1st left and then left again. Follow the trail, keeping left at the T.
4. Stay right at the next turnoff and then turn left just before the yellow gate.
5. At the next left, look left up the trail to find the post on a tree on your right.
6. Turn back and walk to the trail and turn left, back to the parking area.

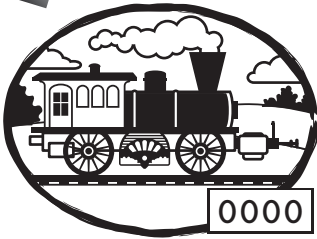

CLUES for your hike!

1. From the parking area, enter the path near the pavilion, keeping it on your right.
2. At the Y, turn left on to the stone path. Follow the path around the marsh area, passing several disc golf baskets.
3. At the Y, stay left and when you come to the next Y, stay left again.
4. The path now enters some woods, and you go down some stone steps. Stay right on the path and you will find the post on your right, just before a disc golf basket.
5. Continue on the path to another parking area. Walk carefully across the parking area and turn right to head back to your vehicle.

CLUES for your hike!

1. From the parking area, take the paved path near the short white fence away from the parking area. The pavilion will be on your left.
2. Turn right at the T and head up the hill. At the top of the hill, turn right with the fence on your left.
3. Carefully walk along the road of the park entrance. At the top of the road, turn left onto the gravel path.
4. When you reach the pavilion, walk down the steps and pass the pavilion on your left.
5. Turn left just after the pavilion and exit onto the paved path where there is a break in the guardrail, next to the dog waste station.
6. Walk down the path, with the river on your right and locate the post just ahead on your left.
7. Continue on the path and head toward the next pavilion. Notice the very cool cow art on your left.
8. Turn left at the pavilion and back to the parking area.

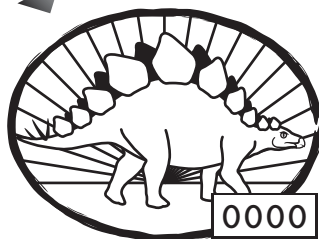

1. From the parking area, enter the paved path by the pavilion. Walk to the sign and turn right, keeping the pavilion on your right.
2. The path will curve right, and you will pass by the playground area.
3. Follow the path as it curves to the left. At the gazebo, you can find the post on your right.
4. Continue on the path, which will go around behind a baseball field.
5. Pass a red bench swing and return to the parking area.

Your **SITE MARKER** rubbing should look like this:



Did You Know?

While still small, the T-Rex's arms were over three feet long and may have been capable of bench pressing 400 pounds each.

CLUES for your hike!

1. Park near the park entrance and enter the paved path to the right of the entrance, with the basketball court behind you. The flagpole will be on your right as you enter the path.
2. The path will curve right with a fence on your left. Continue to follow the path as it curves around a baseball field and heads toward a large playground area.
3. Walk past the pavilion and a 2nd parking area, heading towards a smaller playground on your right.
4. Just past the playground, stay straight on the path into the woods. The post will be ahead on your left.
5. Continue on the path in the same direction and stay right on the path toward the open field.
6. At the T, turn left and follow the path back to the parking area.

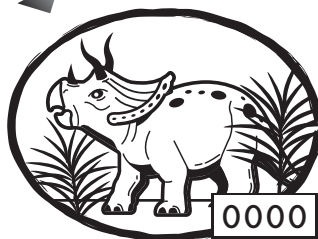

1. From the parking area, start on the paved path by baseball field #2 and the concession stand.
2. Turn right on the path, keeping field #2 on your right.
3. The path will then bear right, and you will pass a path that cuts off to the left. Do not turn here but continue straight.
4. The path will bend to the right, and you will pass the Flower Garden.
5. Pass the sand volleyball courts and field #4 on your right.
6. Just before field #3, find the post on your left.
7. Continue on the path in the same direction, past the pavilion and back to the parking area.

PARK DIRECTIONS

All directions begin from Cumberland County Courthouse, 1 Courthouse Square, Carlisle PA 17013. If you are traveling from a different area, please consult a map or other means to find starting points. Hours of operation are dawn to dusk unless otherwise noted or posted.

Adams-Ricci Park (Arrowhead)

100 East Penn Drive, Enola, PA 17025

Directions to Parking Area: Get on I-81 N from E. High St. and PA-641 E/W Trindle Rd. Follow I-81 N to PA-944 E/Wertzville Rd. in Hampden Township. Take Exit 61 from I-81 N. (12.4 miles). Keep right on Wertzville Rd. and drive for 2 miles. Turn right on E. Penn Dr., drive 0.6 miles, and turn right on Magaro Road. Turn left into the park. Stay to the right and drive past the tennis courts to the back parking area, near a green playground structure and the West Enola Pavilion.

Biddle Mission Park (Cannon)

311 East North Street, Carlisle, PA 17013

Directions to Parking Area: Follow N. Hanover St. for about 0.2 miles. Turn right on E. North St. and travel for 0.4 miles. Turn left into the park, then left into the parking area.

Centerville Community Park (Coal Mining)

55 Penn Drive, Newville, PA 17241

Directions to Parking Area: Get on I-81 S from S. Hanover St. toward Chambersburg. Take Exit 37 from I-81 S (9.5 miles), toward Newville. Turn left on PA-233 S/Centerville Rd. and drive for 1.5 miles. Turn right on PA-174 W/Walnut Bottom Rd. and drive for 0.2 miles. Turn right on Penn Dr. and park in the stone parking area.

Hampden Township Veterans Park (Battlefield)

4345 Marketplace Way, Enola, PA 17025

Directions to Parking Area: Get on I-81 N from E. High St. and PA-641 E/W. Trindle Rd. Follow I-81 N to PA-944 E/Wertzville Rd. in Hampden Township. Take Exit 61 from I-81 N. (12.4 miles). Turn left on Valley Rd. and then left on Marketplace Way. Drive 0.2 miles and turn left at the next left. Drive past the parking area on your right, make a left, and then another left to the parking area.

Hopewell Township Park (Triceratops)

Directions to Parking Area: Follow W. High St and drive 1.0 miles. Turn right on N. Orange St., then an immediate left on PA-641 (Newville Rd.), and drive 21.7 miles. Turn left on PA-696 (Water St./Shippensburg Rd.); continue 1.0 mile. The park will be on the right. Park near the main entrance, with the pavilion to your right.

Michaux State Forest (Fossil)

10099 Lincoln Way E, Fayetteville, PA 17222 (District Office)

Directions to Parking Area: Get on I-81 S from S. Hanover St. toward Chambersburg. Drive 18.0 miles and take Exit 29 from I-81 S. Turn left on PA-174 E/Walnut Bottom Rd. and then turn right on Hershey Rd. for about 1.0 miles. The road then becomes Neil Rd. for about 1.0 miles. Turn left on Cleversburg Rd., then right on White House Rd. This will become Baltimore Rd. in about 1.0 miles. Continue for 1.5 miles, then bear right on Milesburn Rd. Drive 5.4 miles and then turn left on Birch Run Rd. The small parking area will be on your right at the trailhead.

Negley Park (Stegosaurus)

418 Cumberland Road, Lemoyne, PA 17043

Directions to Parking Area: Get on I-81 N from E. High St. and PA-641 E/W Trindle Rd. Drive 18 miles and take Exit 59 PA-581 E toward US-11/Camp Hill/I-83. Take Exit 6C for I-83 S toward I-76/York/Baltimore/Lemoyne to Lowther St. and drive for 0.5 miles. Turn left on S. 3rd St. and then left on Market St. Turn right on N. 5th St. for 0.3 miles. Turn right on Cumberland Rd. and then left into the park. Keep left and drive to the parking area.

Opossum Lake (Farming)

220 Opossum Lake Rd., Carlisle, PA 17015

Directions to Park Area: Drive west on W. High St. (US-11) for 1.0 mile. Turn right on N. Orange St., then an immediate left on PA-641 (Newville Road). Drive 0.6 miles. Turn right on McClures Gap Rd. and drive 2.9 miles. Turn left on Campground Rd., then bear left, staying on Campground Rd. At the stop sign, continue straight on Mt. Zion Rd. When you see the lake ahead of you, drive past the first parking area on your right, by the dam. The road then curves sharply to the left past the dam and then right over a narrow bridge. The parking area is just past the bridge on the right side of the road.

Pine Grove Furnace State Park – Fuller Lake Day Use Parking Area (Forestry)

Directions to Parking Area: Get on I-81 S from the Hanover St. interchange. Drive 9.5 miles to Exit 37 for PA-233 S. Turn left on PA 233-S and drive for 8 miles. Turn left on Pine Grove Rd. and drive 0.1 miles. Turn right into the Fuller Lake Day Use Area parking area.

Potteiger Park (T-Rex)

36 John King Ln., Mechanicsburg, PA 17050

Directions to Parking Area: Get on I-81 N from E. High St. and PA-641 E/W. Trindle Rd. Drive 3.0 miles and take Exit 52 A for US-11 toward New Kingstown. Take slight right on US-11 N for 2.0 miles. Turn right on W. Main St. extended for 0.3 miles. Turn right toward John King Ln. at New Kingstown Market Pizza and then turn right on John King Ln. Drive to the parking area on your left.

Roof Park (Tunnel)

599 Lewisberry Rd., New Cumberland, PA 17070

Directions to Parking Area: Get on I-81 N from E High St and PA-641 E/W Trindle Rd. Follow I-81 10.3 miles. Take exit 59 to merge onto PA-581 E. Drive to exit 6B-6C for I-83 S. Drive 2.3 miles to exit 39A for PA-114/ Lewisberry Rd. Turn left onto Lewisberry Road (PA-114) for 1.5 miles to the park entrance on your right.

Seven Gables Park (Petroglyph)

3 Giant Ave., Carlisle, PA 17013

Directions to Parking Area: Take E. High St. east for about 0.5 miles and turn slight right on York Rd. Turn right on Giant Ln. and then turn left into the parking area.

Simpson Park (Railroad)

2701 S. Market St., Mechanicsburg, PA 17055

Directions to Parking Area: Take E. High St. (PA-74) east and turn slight right on PA-74 S/York Rd. for 3.0 miles. Turn left on Shughart Rd. and drive 2.0 miles. Turn right on Lisburn Rd. for 6.2 miles. Turn right on S. Market St. and then turn left into the park. Use the smaller parking area on your left as you enter.

Spring Meadows Park (Flag)

640 W. First St., Boiling Springs, PA 17007

Directions to Parking Area: Take E. High St. (PA-74/PA-641) for 0.5 miles and turn slight right on York Rd. (PA-74) for 0.5 miles. Turn right on Petersburg Rd. for 3.0 miles. Turn left on E. Old York Rd. (PA-174 E) for 0.8 miles. Turn right into the park and turn right to park in the first parking area.

West Pennsboro Township Park (Oil Well)

30 Park Rd., Plainfield, PA

Directions to Parking Area: Take W. High St. (US-11) west for 1.0 miles. Turn right onto N. Orange St (PA-64). Turn left onto Newville Rd (PA-641) for 3.8 miles. Newville Rd becomes E. Main St. Turn right onto Park Rd to park entrance. Drive through the gates, turn right and turn right into the first parking area. Park near the first pavilion.

STAY SAFE OUTDOORS

When you're outdoors, you could run into bugs, animals, poisonous plants, and other risks and dangers. Keep these **safety tips** in mind on your adventures:

- Know the parks and places you're going to visit *before* you get there.
- Follow any park rules and respect the environment. Take trash home.
- Never hike alone, and let others know where you're going.
- Keep your valuables safe — lock them in your vehicle or take them with you.
- Protect yourself from the sun — wear a hat and use sunscreen.
- Stay hydrated — bring water along and drink even if you aren't thirsty.
- Stay alert for the weather and seek safe shelter if it gets dangerous.
- Watch your step — logs, branches, roots, and rocks can trip you up!
- Poison ivy, oak, or sumac might be near a trail or post — be careful!
- Look out for wild things — spiders, snakes, bugs, and other critters.
- Keep annoying bugs away — use bug repellent spray or other products.
- Use caution around all bodies of water — ponds, rivers, and streams.
